Ric and Dawn Duquès Hall & Norma Lee and Morton Fungler Hall
Fact Sheet

GW's School of Business prepares students for professional management careers. The depth and variety of its academic and professional programs, including five specialized master's programs, provide rich opportunities for students in the school's core Bachelor of Business Administration, Master of Business Administration, and doctoral programs. GW's undergraduate- and graduate-level business programs rank among the world's best, including top tier rankings by *U.S. News and World Report*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Financial Times*, and *Beyond Grey Pinstripes*.

In January 2006, the School of Business opened its new complex, the newly constructed Ric and Dawn Duquès Hall and the renovated Norma Lee and Morton Fungler Hall. This complex provides students, faculty, and staff with a unified center for study and career development activities.

CONSTRUCTION & RENOVATION

- Six-story Duquès Hall constructed (more than 168,000 square feet).
- Floors three through six of Fungler Hall renovated (more than 68,000 square feet).
- Cost of construction and renovation resulting in new business school complex is approximately \$56 million.
- Classes begun Spring Semester 2006.

FACILITIES

- Duquès Hall features 27 classrooms, lab, and presentation rooms that seat 1056 students in addition to breakout rooms, faculty and student lounges, and study areas.
- The first floor of Duquès Hall features a 115-seat auditorium.
- The first floor of Duquès Hall features the food venue Java City.
- Duquès Hall features the Capital Markets Room that provides software and financial information systems for financial modeling, trading, and portfolio management.
- Duquès Hall features a Behavioral Lab that will be used to conduct focus groups and provide marketing and sales instruction.
- The Graduate and Undergraduate Business Career Center is now housed in Duquès Hall.
- The new facility houses office space for approximately 300 faculty and staff members.
- All new high-tech classrooms include projector screens, ceiling mounted overhead projectors, TV/VCR/DVD, instructor complex, voice amplification, program amplification, controls built into lectern, document cameras, slide converters, and wireless microphones.
- Two underground parking levels with 194 parking spaces.

ABOUT THE DUQUÈS FAMILY

In May 2002, Ric Duquès, and his wife Dawn, pledged to donate \$5 million to name the new home of the GW School of Business, the "Ric and Dawn Duquès Hall." Ric Duquès is the CEO of First Data Corporation. Duquès earned a B.A. in accountancy in 1965 and a M.B.A. in accountancy and finance in 1969, both from GW. He also serves on GW's Board of Trustees, and earned a GW Distinguished Alumni Achievement Award in 1993. Dawn Duquès earned a B.A. at GW's School of Education and Human Development in 1968. Their son, David, graduated from GW with a B.B.A. in 1997, and their daughter, Tiffany, graduated with a B.B.A. in 2002.

ABOUT NORMA LEE AND MORTON FUNGER HALL

Fungler Hall was opened in 1970 and originally called Building C. The building's name was changed to Norma Lee and Morton Fungler Hall in recognition of a substantial gift to the Campaign for GW from Mr. and Mrs. Morton Fungler. Morton Fungler, B.A. '53, is a partner at Ralmer Corporation and an emeritus trustee at GW.

PROJECT

The project consists of renovating floors 3 through 6 of Fungler Hall and constructing Duquès Hall, a 6 story addition to Fungler Hall.

USE

- **Parking:** 194 Parking spaces are provided on two underground levels below Fungler Hall and Duquès Halls.
- **Academic:** The project adds 27 classrooms, lab and presentation rooms that seat 1056 students in addition to breakout rooms, faculty and student lounges, and study areas.
- **Offices:** Fungler Hall and Duquès Hall will contain offices for approximately 125 faculty, 80 staff and 95 adjuncts along with reception areas, conference rooms, and pantries.
- **Retail:** One 1,536 sq. ft. food venue located on the first floor with entrances from 22nd Street, the Terrace and Duquès Hall.
