- UW 1020 (*University Writing*) and two (2) courses designated as WID (*Writing in the Disciplines*) courses are required.
- Signature courses are marked with a red carat (^). These courses must be taken at GWU.
- A minor outside of the Business School is not required for the BAccy, but is required for the BBA. Please work closely with your academic advisor if you select a minor.
- Electives may include courses in/out of the Business School, may be used to pursue a second concentration, to study abroad, explore different disciplines, but may not include LSPA (Lifestyle, Sport, and Physical Activity) courses.
- Certain courses on this academic plan may be moved from one semester to another; work closely with your academic advisor if doing so.
